The Foundation supports research and educational activities focused on improving patient care and projects that contribute directly or indirectly to the health and well-being of communities.

Our History

In 2018, the AMR Foundation for Research and Education became a DBA of the GMR Foundation for Research and Education.

In 2012, AMR was selected as one of nine partners in the HeartRescue Project, a multi-year initiative aimed at increasing the survival rate for victims of sudden cardiac arrest by 50 percent. The GMR Foundation for Research and Education's first action was to provide a platform for the HeartRescue Project.

In 2013, the GMR Foundation adopted the annual golf tournament as its second project, the GMR Foundation for Research and Education Golf Tournament. Together, these two initiatives provide the underpinnings for the GMR Foundation for Research and Education.

Institutional Scholarship Grants

The GMR Foundation awarded **\$107,900** in tuition scholarships to **eight EMT and paramedic-training institutions** that applied for funding. Following the Foundation's guidelines, the institutions developed a selection process to identify recipients who

demonstrated financial need and enrolled in EMT or paramedic programs. Many of the students are working full-time jobs, supporting families and trying to complete a rigorous full-time education (classroom, clinical and field requirements).

EMS professionals. The GMR Foundation has provided **\$35,000** in scholarship funding for EMS professionals to attend the 2025 Annual Meeting in San Diego, California, January 6–11. Delaney Kenyon, University of Pittsburgh

NAEMSP EMS Fellowship Research Grant

The GMR Foundation awarded a **\$20,000** grant to a [National Association of EMS Physicians](#) (NAEMSP) member to conduct prehospital care research as part of a NAEMSP EMS Fellowship Research project.

The funding supports research performed by an EMS Fellow who is paired with an EMS Faculty Member. NAEMSP members include thousands of physicians, paramedics, nurses, administrators, educators, researchers and key EMS personnel.

EMS Fellows must be enrolled in an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).



Research plans focus on significance, innovation, approach and ethics/human subjects. Applications are evaluated by a subcommittee of the NAEMSP Research Committee.

ESO/PCRF Research Forum Sponsorships



The GMR Foundation provided **\$8,577** in research funding to support continuing education and professional development opportunities for physicians and frontline providers at the [ESO](#) and [UCLA Prehospital Care Research Forum \(PCRF\)](#). The three-day, immersive research-forum workshop pairs dedicated participants with experienced clinical mentors, insightful methodologists and expert statisticians. Through collaborative discussions and hands-on guidance, this workshop aims to harness the power of data to enhance community health and safety.

Each group works on a single research project. PCRF faculty partners with ESO to help participants obtain Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval for de-identified retrospective database review projects. Statisticians, programmers and editors are available on-site to provide immediate and step-by-step support, helping participants access data, conduct statistical analysis and prepare an abstract for submission or presentation.



2024 GMR Foundation Financial Summary

The financial summary for the GMR Foundation for Research and Education includes revenue from the golf tournament. The revenue generated from the golf tournament plays a significant role, serving as a major source of funding. Expenditures include grant and scholarship awards, CARES database maintenance, educational expenses, conferences and miscellaneous expenses. GMR Foundation Leadership Team

The GMR Foundation's mission, policy and direction are guided by a 12-member Board of Directors and an Executive Director who are responsible for supporting the Foundation's vision. Together, they offer leadership, guidance and feedback to individuals and communities involved in Foundation-sponsored projects, examine financial reports, establish policy and direction for the foundation and contribute to fundraising efforts.

Randy Strozyk, President

Randy Strozyk joined the Board in October 2018, bringing more than 45 years of experience in EMS operations and management. He served on the GMR leadership team for more than 25 years and retired in December 2024 as GMR's Senior Vice President of Executive Operations. Randy is currently serving as a senior advisor at GMR.

Strozyk earned his EMT/paramedic certification and worked on an ambulance while studying microbiology at Washington State University. He later earned an MBA from California State University. He has been heavily involved with the American Ambulance Association (AAA) for nearly two decades and served as the AAA's president in 2023-2024. Strozyk holds a Bachelor of Science in Microbiology and a Master in Business Administration.

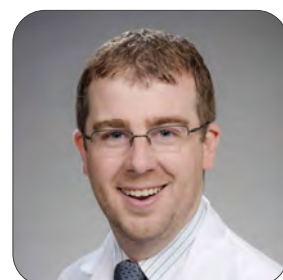


Andrew McCoy, MD, Board Member

We also provided \$8,577 in research funding for continuing education at notable forums, helping physicians and frontline EMS providers stay at the forefront of medical advances. These initiatives reflect our commitment to enhancing patient care and supporting the ongoing development of healthcare professionals.

Furthermore, we were thrilled to offer \$35,000 in scholarships for EMS professional development, which enabled 75 recipients to attend the National Association of EMS Physicians® Annual Meeting. Our support for NAEMSP EMS Fellow Research projects with an investment of \$20,000 underscores our dedication to fostering research and innovation in our field.
