



When you see flashing lights or hear an emergency vehicle siren, get out of the way as quickly and safely as possible. It is important to remember these simple rules:



PULL OVER

When you hear or see an emergency vehicle of any type approaching from the rear, pull as far to the right as possible—or to the left, if there is no other option—and stop. Remain where you are until all emergency vehicles have passed.



FOLLOW DIRECTIONS

If there is a roadway crash, use caution and follow the instructions of emergency personnel.



STAY BACK

If you're traveling behind an emergency vehicle that is driving with lights and sirens, stay at least 500 feet back whenever possible.



BE ALERT AND PATIENT

It can take time to provide medical care to victims and clear the roadway. Emergency personnel appreciate your patience and courtesy.
